Worksheet 1: Help a Lost Pet Find His Home

Work with a partner to answer the following questions.

You have found a pet who appears to be lost and want to help this pet find his or her home.

What would you do to help this pet?

Who would you tell about the pet you found? Why would you contact these people or groups?

Sometimes pets have a microchip. What kind of information is on the microchip? Why do you think it a good idea for a pet to have a microchip?

It is suggested that if you find a lost pet that you create a flyer and post it and distribute copies to your neighbors.

Let's design a flyer about the pet you have found. The questions below can help you decide what kind of information you might or might not want to include in your flyer:

Why might it not be a good idea to give your address?

Why might it be a good idea to give only your first name or your parents' first names?

Is it a good idea to include a photograph of the pet you found? Why or why not?
